#### Reception



Our focus this week has been on wild animals and we started the week by looking at and listening to a soundscape on Henri Rousseau's 'Surprised' as part of a 'big draw' activity with Miss Kate. We are looking forward to creating some wonderful artwork over the coming weeks linked to this painting. We are also having great fun in our music lessons with Miss Larkin where we are learning to control and manipulate symbols and sounds about the weather. We can't wait to do it again next week so that everyone gets a chance to

conduct! In Maths we have been continuing our focus on numbers to 20 where we have enjoyed ordering numbers, writing and recognising them through a range of activities. It has been wonderful that we have been able to take our learning outdoors this week - long may the sunshine continue!

#### Year 1

This week we have been exploring the different parts of plants, we even got the opportunity to dissect our own plant. In Maths, we have been exploring fractions for the first time, halving and quartering shapes as well as discussing the functions of the numerator and the denominator! This week in English, we have been focusing on adverbs and using them to describe the way that we do things. We enjoyed an adverb hunt around the classroom, adverb charades and improving our model text by adding adverbs.' We are so impressed in Year 1, KEEP IT UP!'



#### Year 2



Another lovely 4 day week, with lots of learning! On Tuesday, we enjoyed a drop everything and draw session with Miss Kate. In Maths, we started fractions and used playdough to make parts of wholes. We then looked at halves and we look forward to learning about guarters and thirds next week. In Science, we

experimented with different materials to make our own boats. We then tested them out in water to see if they actually floated! We also had a lot of fun in our Drama workshop. Thank you to our mystery readers too, we had a great time listening to the funny stories about our bodies. Well done to the Year 2s, who represented Maple Walk in a football tournament on Friday!

#### In the upper school...

#### Year 3



We have had an action-packed week. They enjoyed another wonderful workshop with Miss Kate where they explored a painting using different drawing techniques inspired by sound and action. In Science, they put their scientific knowledge of parts of a flower into practice as they dissected flowers to find the stamen (male) and the carpel (female) parts of the flower to better understand how seeds are made to start the new life cycle of the plant. They will be able to further their knowledge when we go on our school trip to Kew Gardens next week. Great work Year 3!

#### Year 4

We had a very busy start to the week with the Big Draw on Tuesday morning. They used a range of techniques and participated in a discussion on feelings and how to show these in art. This was followed by the Cross Country tournament on Tuesday afternoon where everyone who participated did extremely well. In Science we started our science unit - sound on Thursday. We proved that sound is made when things vibrate and explored a number of experiments such as making water jump, string telephones, playing 'baby shark' by water pouring and looking at the vibrations on stringed instruments. Huge huge well done to all for learning lines and writing their own assembly!



#### Year 5



After a fantastic week in the Lake District, the children have quickly settled back into the classroom routines. In English, they have been drafting recounts of their field trip and in Art they have begun to design textile landscapes, inspired by the beautiful landscape we explored.

#### Sports and PE

Y3-4 represented Maple Walk on Tuesday in the Brent Cross Country. Congratulations to all students that took part. You were all fantastic persevering during the entire race, giving your best. Some Year 2s have taken part today in the U7 ISA football competition. Amazing performance from all of them. We are super proud of you!
